



## 1<sup>st</sup> NRN Meeting (2014-2020)

### Working towards the common network objectives

<b>Date and location</b>	5 <sup>th</sup> (pm) & 6 <sup>th</sup> (am) November 2014 - Brussels Renaissance Brussels Hotel, Rue du Parnasse 19, 1050 Brussels
<b>Rationale</b>	<p>The 1st NRN Meeting (2014-2020) will be primarily targeted at National Support Unit (NSU) representatives. Subsequent meetings are expected to flow from this engaging selected NRN stakeholders/stakeholder groups (rather than merely NSUs or MAs) based on the 'topic' of the meetings.</p> <p>The main rationale behind the meeting is that the <b>ENRD and National Rural Networks (NRNs)</b> work towards a <b>common set of objectives</b> during the 2014-2020 programming period, namely <i>increasing the involvement of rural stakeholders, improving the quality of rural development programmes, and informing the broader public and potential beneficiaries about rural development programmes</i>. In order to efficiently reach this common set of objectives it is essential that the ENRD and NRNs (and as a first layer of cooperation ENRD CP and NSUs) support each other through joint working.</p>
<b>Overall aim &amp; specific objectives</b>	<p>The overall aim of the meeting is to develop a <b>shared understanding, initiate and endorse the process of cooperation between the ENRD Contact Point and NSUs</b>. More specifically, the meeting aims to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• briefly introduce participants to the 2014-2020 Rural Networks' (ENRD and EIP) organisation and strategic framework and to the 2014-2020 ENRD Contact Point.</li><li>• explore how the Contact Point, NSUs and NRN members can interact in a mutually supportive manner to achieve common networking objectives using shared tools, approaches and methods.</li></ul>
<b>Programme</b>	<p>The first part of the agenda (Day 1) leads through the governance structure of EU Rural Networks (ENRD and EIP-AGRI-network), the strategic approach and key activities of the ENRD Contact Point. The second part of the agenda (Day 2) allows for <b>exchange among participants</b> building on past experience of NRNs and the ENRD, using an interactive/participative <b>methodology</b>.</p>
